

Descriptions of mature groups data:

2) Social club A4 Black Pen

The group decided it was a social club where they can meet their friends and family.

- 1) CCTV cameras, this is where the police and employers can look into what you are doing.
- 2) Door person, who was employed by them to keep people **in or** out who they didn't want
- 3) In the social club there is a VIP room, where family are situated, the group members said they situated themselves in this room, illustrated are windows where they can see out of it into the rest of the club and a door so they can go out and sit at other tables if they want but primarily they are in there. Some participants said their children were in the VIP room with them but some said they were in a different club more like a Disco.
- 4) Sign asking people to donate to charity, the participants saw Facebook as a way for getting people to donate to their causes.
- 5) Crack in the wall, this is where unwanted people can see in and may be able to enter the club.
- 6) A quiet introverted person who is scared of showing too much about themselves.
- 7) Friends chatting around a table, there is also a plate. The plate illustrates the posting of food pictures.
- 8) Notice board for events, and holidays photos.
- 9) This illustrates that there is a children's club away from their club (see point 3).
- 10) This is the bar where people can sit and have a laugh, underneath it is illustrated that people have the ability to move tables if they want.
- 11) These words just make the point that their club is less nosy than a children's club, in the sense there is less going on.
- 12) Underneath the title it says no work colleagues. This is because they agreed that they didn't want to add work colleagues.

Overall thoughts:

This group responded much like the group 1, situated themselves in the family room, although they discussed much less social roles going on, they said their roles were much more just chatting with friends and family. These participants were much more worried about how they were portrayed to others, they said they didn't want to be seen as boastful so would be careful about putting pictures of themselves up on too many holidays
